**MUSKEGON PD REPORT (2020-19124):**

On 10/16/20 Muskegon City Clerk Ann Meisch and Deputy Clerk Kimberly Young contacted the Muskegon Police Department after noticing irregularities in voter registration applications received both in person and by mail.

Meisch received a small quantity and then larger quantities of voter registration applications by mail from a female later identified as [REDACTED]. It was found that [REDACTED] was working for a company called [REDACTED] who also went by the name [REDACTED]. Meisch stated that in her opinion a quantity of the voter registration forms were highly suspicious and possibly fraudulent. Meisch's opinion was based on the fact that numerous forms appeared to have been completed by the same writer and upon initial examination addresses on multiple forms were invalid or non-existent. Meisch investigated further and found that phone numbers on multiple forms were erroneous and signatures on multiple forms didn't appear to match signatures on file with the Department of Secretary of State. Examples included an address in the [REDACTED] and another in the [REDACTED]. Those addresses do not exist in the Muskegon City house numbering system. Another form listed 80 W. Southern Ave which is the address for Muskegon High School and is clearly not a residence.

Meisch found that all the suspected fraudulent applications came from a mailing address [REDACTED] at two locations [REDACTED]. Meisch stated some of the initial forms were dropped off on 10/8/20 by a [REDACTED] who identified herself as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated she was employed by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated the company was working to register voters and help registered voters obtain absentee ballots. [REDACTED] provided her cell phone number [REDACTED]. Meisch stated she later found [REDACTED] on Facebook and stated the picture [REDACTED].

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in the profile matched the [REDACTED] who dropped off the applications. Meisch told Officers that [REDACTED] appeared reluctant to talk about specifics regarding the company and stated she would have to talk to her supervisor before answering any additional questions. Meisch estimated that [REDACTED] had delivered between 8,000-10,000 voter registration forms to the Muskegon City Clerk's office. Meisch turned over 42 suspected fraudulent applications to Officer Foster for examination.

On 10/20/20 (deadline day for in-person voter registration applications) [REDACTED] returned to the Muskegon City Clerk's office to deliver additional registration forms in person. Meisch estimated that [REDACTED] brought an additional 2500 forms. Meisch contacted the Muskegon Police Department and Detective Logan Anderson and Captain Shawn Bride conducted a non-custodial interview with [REDACTED] initially provided a fictitious date of birth. It was discovered that [REDACTED] told Detectives she worked for [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said she was hired in Michigan in August of 2020 and is paid \$1150 per week to find un-registered voters and provide them with a form so they can get registered to vote or obtain their absentee ballot. [REDACTED] stated she has worked in different areas of Michigan and is provided a rental car and lodged in local hotels. [REDACTED] initially told investigators that "canvassers" are paid for each form that is completed but later stated that they were paid hourly no matter how many forms were turned in. [REDACTED] stated that "canvassers" are paid through a reloadable "pay card". [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] has done work in Muskegon, Detroit, Ypsilanti, Southfield, Flint and Lansing.

[REDACTED] was asked how voter registration forms were screened for accuracy and processed. [REDACTED] stated she vetted the forms for accuracy and non-usable forms were placed in "stacks" at the Southfield [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated the forms were then uploaded into the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was nervous throughout the interview but maintained that the initiative being conducted by [REDACTED] was legitimate. Detectives confirmed that [REDACTED] was driving an Enterprise Rental vehicle (2020 Volkswagen MI, DMY9486) and the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] left Muskegon after the interview.

Detective Kory Luker from Muskegon PD used the above information to draft a search warrant for GPS location information for the phone of [REDACTED]. The search warrant was signed on 10/22/20 and location information became available on 10/23/20.

**LOCATE [REDACTED] OFFICE SOUTHFIELD, MI:**

On 10/23/20 Detective Luker gave me several addresses derived from location information from [REDACTED] Phone. The phone was located at [REDACTED] with an accuracy of 8 meters for a prolonged period of time. I contacted D/F/Lt Weimer from 2<sup>nd</sup> District SIS and requested he send personnel to check the address. On 10/23/20 at 4:00pm D/Tpr's Kevin Pirvu and Stephanie Chang went to [REDACTED] Rd. They indicated that the Tel Nine Office Plaza was located at the venue. Upon entering the public area Detectives found that [REDACTED] had a placard affixed for [REDACTED] Pirvu and Chang stated they saw an unknown male and female working inside. Photographs were taken, and the Troopers also ran the plate of a black Nissan in the parking lot (MI Reg EDL6130). The registration [REDACTED] The Troopers also stated that a medical supply and financial consulting business had suites in the building. The below list of vehicles were also in the parking lot of the Tel Nine Office Plaza:

On 10/26/20 I requested that the Troopers re-check [REDACTED] D/Tpr. Pirvu checked the parking lot but did not find the 2020 Volkswagen rental vehicle or the Black Nissan [REDACTED] D/Tpr. Pirvu find two mini-vans [REDACTED]

I also requested that D/Tpr. Pirvu check the address of [REDACTED] This is the other address used on [REDACTED] return mailing labels for voter registration forms sent to the Muskegon City Clerk's office. D/Tpr. Pirvu found the [REDACTED] is the address for the [REDACTED]

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**RESEARCH** [REDACTED]

To find out more about [REDACTED] I conducted several open-source "Google" searches. I found job postings offered by [REDACTED] on both *Jobsearcher.com* and *Jobattic.com*. The posting on *Jobatic.com* by [REDACTED] offered an administrative assistant position in Muskegon Heights, MI. The posting stated that the position paid \$15.00 per four for data entry working on a voter registration project. The position description stated that the person would check the accuracy of voter registration cards while entering them into a system and would be calling registrants to get information for incomplete cards, scan the cards and help with payroll.

I also found multiple expired postings on *Jobsearcher.com* for [REDACTED] in Flint, MI including "Regional Field Manager, Supervisor and Driver, Voter Registration Specialist and Field Canvasser. There were also postings for Regional Field Managers in Washington DC and Chicago, IL.

**OPEN SOURCE INFORMATION ON** [REDACTED]

MSP MIOC Analyst Parker Degroot used Tennessee Licensing information to determine that [REDACTED] administratively dissolved on 5/5/19. A company [REDACTED] was formed using the address [REDACTED] on 8/28/20. [REDACTED] is the listed address for [REDACTED] and the name [REDACTED] was provided to Muskegon PD investigators by Enterprise Rental Car Company while conducting initial workups on the vehicle driven by [REDACTED]. A check run through TN SOS shows [REDACTED]. The new company [REDACTED] using the address of [REDACTED] but does not list him as an agent of the business. The [REDACTED] business document will be added to external documents.

Analyst Degroot researched [REDACTED] Degroot found that [REDACTED] had a vendor recipient profile dating back to 2014. In the 2018 mid-term campaign cycle Degroot found that [REDACTED] was paid \$1,571,386 by the Doug Jones for Senate Committee, \$657,260 by the New American Jobs Fund and \$188,000 by the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee. All of these listings will be added as external documents. Initial workups suggest the majority of [REDACTED] work was found democratic candidates and organizations.

Although the final numbers for the 2020 campaign cycle won't be available for quite some time estimates were located using the same website. [REDACTED] was estimated to receive \$242,133 from Joe Biden for President and \$242,133 from Gary Peters for Senate.

**RESEARCH** [REDACTED] **IN MICHIGAN LARA SYSTEM:**

I ran [REDACTED] through the Michigan LARA (licensing and regulatory affairs) business entity search. [REDACTED]

Analyst Degroot and I ran both LARA and Google searches for [REDACTED]. I found a 2013 Mlive newspaper article that stated [REDACTED] was a collaborative effort for Michigan urban communities

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by 3 Grand Rapids advisers and friends. No recent references were found and no connection to [REDACTED] was located. I also searched [REDACTED] using the Michigan LARA business entity search. I found a non-profit business named [REDACTED] that was created by former State of Michigan Senator Mike Nofs. Nofs last served in the Michigan Senate in 2018. The non-profits stated purpose is community enhancement and charitable activities. Looking through the annual statements I found no connection between Mike Nofs, [REDACTED]

**COLLABORATION WITH MICHIGAN SECRETARY OF STATE:**

Investigators had several online meetings with AG Investigators, Muskegon PD, MSP and representatives from the Michigan Secretary of State. Michigan SOS Analyst Corey Ames prepared a spreadsheet with information supplied by the Muskegon City Clerk's Office and Muskegon Police Department. Each suspicious voter registration form and other samples were sent to Ames for analysis and comparison to the MDOS Qualified Voter File and Driver Information Database. On 10/26/20 the spreadsheet highlighting irregularities was then sent to Muskegon PD for follow up investigation and comparison.

**FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION MUSKEGON PD:**

On 10/27/20 Detective Luker conducted follow up investigation based on the analysis done by MDOS Analyst Ames. Detective Luker contacted me and reported the below findings based on his follow up work:

A. Detective Luker contacted [REDACTED] stated she was approached by an acquaintance [REDACTED] and badgered to fill out a voter registration form. [REDACTED] was shown a completed voter registration application by Detective Luker and she stated she filled out the form but did not sign it. [REDACTED] stated the signature at the bottom of the form was not hers and she had no idea who had signed the form. [REDACTED] was shown a 2<sup>nd</sup> completed form with her name and supposed signature on it. [REDACTED] stated that was not her handwriting and she had no idea who completed the form or signed it. The form had the following errors: fictitious last four numbers of social security number, fictitious phone number and invalid address ([REDACTED]). Your affiant knows McLaughlin and Terrace to be an intersection and not a residence.

B. Detective Luker examined (2) voter registration applications to conduct follow up and found the following issues. Detective Luker found the address on both forms [REDACTED] does not exist. The name on the first form [REDACTED] was searched in Muskegon RMS (County wide report management system), LEIN and Michigan Secretary of State [REDACTED]. The name on the second form was [REDACTED]. That name was searched in the same three databases [REDACTED].

C. Detective Luker examined (2) voter registration applications to conduct follow up and found the following issues. Detective Luker found the address on both forms [REDACTED] does not exist. The name on the first form [REDACTED] was searched in Muskegon RMS, LEIN and Michigan SOS [REDACTED]. The name on the second form is listed as [REDACTED] with a duplicate date of [REDACTED] was searched in the same three databases [REDACTED].

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D. Detective Luker and your affiant examined a batch of (18) separate voter registration applications. When the applications were printed out and placed side by side the handwriting on the (18) forms appear to be done by the same writer and numerous signatures have similar characteristics. Your affiant noted that multiple forms were missing key information, had duplicate last names at different addresses and had inaccurate information.

E. After consulting with Muskegon PD Detectives and MDOS Analyst Corey Ames your affiant would describe the results as finding that a quantity of the voter applications forms are clearly fraudulent, a quantity of the voter application forms are highly suspicious having either erroneous or are missing key pieces of information and merit further follow up and a quantity of the voter registration forms appear to be legitimate based on cross checks and database reviews.

**SURVEILLANCE 10/28/20 & 10/29/20 GRAND HAVEN/MUSKEGON HEIGHTS:**

On 10/28/20 I received a call from Detective Luker. His search warrant for cell phone location information for [REDACTED] elapsed but was renewed and activated on 10/28/20. Luker stated that GPS location showed [REDACTED] phone was at the Best Western in Grand Haven, MI.

On 10/28/20 at 9:15am I went to the Best Western and located a black Nissan Sentra (MI Reg / EDL6130) in the parking lot. A short time later a gray mini-van arrived and parked next to the Nissan. An unidentified black male went into the hotel and left a short time later. Believing the mini-van may be a rental and related to the investigation I followed the van from Grand Haven to Muskegon Heights. The van entered the parking lot at the northwest corner of Hoyt and Broadway. An awning on the business stated it was the "California Eyewear". I did a search on the business and found California Eyewear was no longer in business. The Dodge Caravan was observed to have North Carolina Registration HCA3208. Your affiant ran a LEIN check and [REDACTED] The driver and the three females left eastbound on Broadway in the van. I lost visual contact with the van shortly after.

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While I was conducting surveillance in Muskegon Detective Luker who was still watching the Best Western Hotel. Detective Luker stated a female he visually identified as [REDACTED] left the hotel in the black Nissan Sentra and went to a laundry-mat in Grand Haven. Detective Kyle Hall contacted the Best Western hotel staff and was able to confirm that [REDACTED] had a room rented at the hotel and was due to check out at 10/29/20. Detective Eric Rasch from Grand Haven DPS contacted management and confirmed that [REDACTED] was in room [REDACTED] and is due to check out by 11am on 10/29/20.

I returned to the California Eyewear storefront located at 160 E. Broadway at approximately 5pm. Three different Dodge Rental mini-vans including the one that was followed from [REDACTED] hotel in Grand Haven were observed at the business front. [REDACTED] Numerous unknown persons were witnessed getting out of the mini-van vans and both coming in and going out of the front door of the business.

On 10/29/20 at approximately 10:30am I spoke with Detective Luker. Detective Luker stated he went to 160 E. Broadway at approximately 10:00am and observed two parked mini-vans at the business but no persons inside the business or the vans. Detective Luker was able to retrieve a bag of trash from the rear of the business. Detective Luker found paper in the bag with [REDACTED] information about employee agreements, potential lists of canvassers and COVID policies.

**DRAFT SEARCH WARRANTS 10/28/20:**

On 10/28/20 I drafted a search warrant for [REDACTED] Michigan. The search warrant was reviewed by Assistant Attorney General Richard Cunningham and signed by Waterford District Court Judge Todd Fox.

On 10/28/20 I drafted a search warrant for Room [REDACTED] of the Best Western Hotel in Grand Haven, MI. The search warrant was reviewed by Assistant Attorney General Richard Cunningham and signed by 60<sup>th</sup> District Court Magistrate Cavan Berry.

On 10/29/20 at approximately 1:30pm based on the information received from Detective Luker's trash pull I drafted a search warrant for 160 E. Broadway. I swore to the warrant over the phone and the search warrant was signed in Muskegon.

**INFORMATION:**

On Wednesday (10-28-20) I received a call from D/F/Lt. Anderson regarding this investigation. He asked if I would execute a search warrant on Thursday (10-29-20) at the 'Best Western' in the City of Grand Haven. D/F/Lt. Anderson said that he would be executing a search warrant at the same time, at a field office in Southfield. D/F/Lt. Anderson stated that Muskegon Police Department (MPD) Detective Kory Luker was the MPD contact regarding this case and that he would be assisting at the Grand Haven location.

At approximately 8:00am on Wednesday (10-29-20), I received a call from MPD Det. Kory Luker. Det. Luker said that he had been monitoring the phone pings of the suspect [REDACTED] this morning and that she left the City of Grand Haven at approximately 5:30am. After receiving this information, I drove through the parking lot of the 'Best Western' and noted that [REDACTED] vehicle was not there. I advised Det. Luker that we would wait until 10:00am, the time of the search warrant in Southfield, and then execute the search warrant at the 'Best Western.'

I was contacted by D/F/Lt. Mike Anderson on 10/28/2020 and requested to assist with the execution of a search warrant in Grand Haven on 10/29/2020. D/Sgt. Forner, Grand Haven Department of Public Safety Det. Rasch, and I executed the search warrant at the Best Western Hotel in Grand Haven, room [REDACTED] on 10/29/2020. Se D/Sgt. █████ advised she was a temporary employee of █████ as a canvasser and was reporting for her 3:30 p.m. shift. She worked for the company for approximately three weeks. I asked what her duties entailed, and she said she went door to door in the Muskegon area asking residents to take a survey regarding the upcoming election. █████ explained the survey consisted of questions asking the individuals if they intended to vote, had they already voted, and if they supported former Vice President Joe Biden for President. █████ stated she received \$120.00 per eight-hour day worked, which was loaded onto a Skylight One Netspend card at the end of the work week. █████ produced her card and said she received it when she was hired by the company.

I asked █████ how the survey was conducted, and she advised the team leaders provided the canvassers with tablets that contained the pre-loaded questions they were to ask each survey taker. █████ stated she and other employees were given the tablets upon leaving the vehicle and returned them upon completion. I asked her if the tablets used were in the office and she said yes. Further, she stated each tablet was signed out to a canvasser by their individual team leader, the canvassers did not have total control of the tablets.

I asked █████ if she had other duties as part of her employment with the company. █████ stated her first assignment upon being hired was to get area residents registered to vote. She explained she and other employees set up stations outside of local businesses and asked citizens if they were registered to vote. If they were not and wished to register, the citizen completed a Michigan Voter Registration form on site and █████ turned them in at the end of her shift. █████ advised she never filled out or signed a voter registration application for anyone, all the forms she turned in were completed by the prospective voter. She said she never witnessed other employees completing forms for anyone either. I asked █████ if she was paid per voter application form completed and she said no. She said she was paid \$15.00 per hour no matter the number of completed applications she turned in per day.

I asked █████ who her supervisor was, and she believed █████ was in charge of this office. █████ appeared very uncomfortable talking with me and said she had to leave before people accused her of being a "rat". Further, she stated she had not witnessed illegal activity from other employees, but grew suspicious as she believed she saw undercover officers watching the office the previous day. █████ did not wish to talk any longer and advised we could call her with additional questions. The interview was ended and provided █████ with my business card.

On 10/29/20 I traveled to Southfield with D/Sgt. McMillan (6<sup>th</sup> District SIS) to serve the search warrant at [REDACTED]. On 10/28/20 I contacted D/F/Lt Weimer from 2<sup>nd</sup> District SIS who assigned D/Lt Richard Sanchez and his team to assist us in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District. Two members of the AG Criminal Investigation Division also assisted in the operation.

**BRIEFING / INVESTIGATIVE PLAN:**

We made the investigative plan to [REDACTED]

D/Lt. Sanchez and his crew was tasked with finding [REDACTED]. Details of the surveillance can be found in report number SIS-295-20. Sanchez and his crew did find [REDACTED] and followed her to Roseville and then west on I-96 towards Lansing. The decision was made to traffic stop [REDACTED] and conduct an interview. The traffic stop by Tpr. Prince can be found in complaint number EST-987-20. [REDACTED] was stopped and consented to an interview at the Brighton Post. [REDACTED] was transported to the Brighton Post by Tpr. Prince and was interviewed by AG Investigator's Stephen Morse and Kathryn Teigeler.

I also responded to the Brighton Post and amended the search warrant for [REDACTED] to include the suites across the hall from [REDACTED] after D/Sgt. McMillan and a Trooper from Metro North Post discovered additional Suites associated with [REDACTED].

**INVESTIGATIVE OBSERVATIONS [REDACTED] OFFICES:**

There were several offices and storage rooms located in the two interconnected suites adjacent to suite [REDACTED] (training room) for [REDACTED]. Two of the offices contained several HP Laptop computers in a stack with sticky notes that read "No Files". One of HP Laptops seized was in one of the office hooked up to a document scanner.

A storage room contained several large Husky rolling totes. The totes were labeled and filled with items such as new rain ponchos, hand sanitizer etc. There were several large pelican cases that had cutouts for the tablets located charging on wire shelving and stored in the cases. Detectives conducting the Muskegon search warrant had advised that the tablets were loaded with addresses and canvassers went door to door to conduct "voter education surveys" and in certain cases offered rides to the polls on election day. A sticky note on one of the pelican cases indicated it was ready to be shipped to another location.

The rear store room and office had items associated with manager Brilus (backpack, computer and phone). Several wire storage racks surrounded the border of the room with a white board and bulletin board on other walls. Dozens of new phones were located in boxes. Hundreds of pre-paid payment cards were also found unopened and addressed to [REDACTED]. The cards were from two different companies.

Binders containing employee information, completed van manifests and completed and partially completed voter registration forms were found in the room. In addition to the shelving the room had a long table in the middle with several chairs. Some of the partially completed voter registration applications with sticky notes were found on this table.

Detectives also found pelican cases in the room with semi-automatic rifles joined with suppressors and optics and customized pistols. Brilus indicated that the weapons belonged to owner [REDACTED]. Detectives later found a binder in the room containing valid tax stamps for the suppressors, receipts for several accessories, trust paperwork for the future transfer of the weapons and other documentation. An ATF agent was called to the scene. The weapons were field tested for being fully automatic, examined and found to be legal. One case had 4 rifles and 4 pistols. The other case had 1 rifle and second weapon that appeared to be a short-barreled rifle but qualified as a pistol with a folding stock. The weapons were secured and left in the custody of [REDACTED].

One of the white boards had several notes on it. One of the categories was "Hot Topics". Under "Hot Topics" listed: weapons in the field, prepared for shifts, Covid questionnaire needs to be asked whether canvasser is new or not, mask enforcement, no eating in vans. Another heading was "Tiff GA Project" and the words underneath: 44 Paycards, 30 Phones, 20 tablets. Another heading was "Charleston to Columbia" with the

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words underneath: 10 tabs (Russ), 1 ten port, 2 pads (4). Another heading appeared to show Tablets to be shipped to PA, MIA & ALA

A bulletin board in the room appeared to track employees and vans assigned to different areas of Michigan. The cities, employees and van totals were listed as follows: Benton Harbor [REDACTED] 5 Vans, Muskegon [REDACTED] 6 Vans, Inkster [REDACTED] 3 Vans, Flint [REDACTED] 3 Vans, Southfield [REDACTED] 5 Vans. 2 vans and 3 employees [REDACTED] were at the top of the board and not close to any of the listed cities.

A large quantity of lime green and blue tee shirts were found that said "Empower Michigan" with an outline of the State of Michigan. A receipt was located for the purchase of the shirts in Flint. Numerous contractor agreements were filled out with the names of employees. Canvasser recruiting hand out cards for Detroit were located with a number to text (404) 312-4102 and advertising pay of \$140 per day with bonuses for completing 6 and 7 days of work.
